THE FIGHT AGAINST AIDS

Since the discovery of AIDS nearly 35 years ago, we've made tremendous strides in the prevention and treatment of this disease. But there's still work to be done.

37 MILLION PEOPLE WORLDWIDE are living with HIV/AIDS.

Nearly 26 MILLION of them are living in SUB-SAHARAN AFRICA.

More than half are WOMEN and 2.3 MILLION are CHILDREN

What is an ARV?

Antiretroviral drugs, or ARVs, help keep the amount of HIV in the body at a low level. This stops the immune system from weakening, allowing it to recover from any damage the virus has already caused.

THE COST OF ARVs HAS DROPPED TO \$72 PER YEAR

THAT'S ONLY 20¢ PER DAY

2005

Between 2000-2015, new infections DROPPED BY 35%

That's 58% among children.

Between 2005-2014, AIDS-related deaths in sub-Saharan Africa DROPPED BY 48%

2010

95 MILLION people throughout 119 COUNTRIES were tested for HIV.

2014

73% of pregnant, HIV-positive women receive ARVs.

2015

Total number of people getting treatment rises to 15MM
